Eric,

Reviewing the Rules and Regs, I have the following comments:

- 1.03 & 1.05 note the R&Rs may be amended at any time. I envision a point in time where you have to change the R&R Temporary T1 & T2 timeframe, for example, because the GSA isn't meeting its sustainability goal. A plus for farmers is that the Temporary Water has a defined time frame and ramp down that they can plan on, but how strong a pushback do you get if you have to take it away. Do we have strong enough language, in enough places that this is all subject to change!?
- 3.02 talks about the Online Dashboard, then it drops off the map and isn't discussed again. Won't the dashboard be used to house ET data, Annual Allocation, Carryover Water... for each user? It seems like there should be a mention in each of those sections that the info/data will be available on their dashboard.
- 4.03b uses the term "Transitional Pumping Program." That is the only place that capitalized term is used in the whole document. This probably should be in Definitions, or not used, or not capitalized.

Just some of my thoughts.
